Holiday Inn is the closest, it's about a 3 min drive, ph:709-722-0506. The IHC system is called the Ventana Benchmark and we use their IView detection kits with a DAB chromogen. We use optimum antibodies from Ventana and Zymed, and other antibodies from multiple of vendors like Dako.

We do about 80 immunos a day by three rotating staff. Only two are scheduled daily on immuno's, one staining and one cutting. The pathologists want three dedicated staff just on immunos, this may be a good recommendation.
