Joan M. Gilmour is an Associate Professor at Osgoode Hall Law School, York University and a member of the Bar of Ontario and of British Columbia. She obtained her B.A. and LL.B. degrees from the University of Toronto and after engaging in the private practice of law in Toronto as a member of the firm of Shibley, Righton & McCutcheon, completed her master's and doctoral degrees in law at Stanford University.

She is Director of Osgoode's Master's Program specializing in Health Law and has served as Acting and Associate Director of the York University Centre for Health Studies and Director of Osgoode's Institute for Feminist Legal Studies. Her research spans a wide range of issues in health law, including the effects of the tort system on patient safety, public/private health care, professional regulation, withdrawing life sustaining treatment, regulating complementary and alternative medicine, treating children, and the interrelation of disability, gender, inequality and law. She has served as a consultant to Health Canada and the Ontario Law Reform Commission.
